

Advocacy

ADULT PROTECTION

Investigates and works to resolve reports of abuse, exploitation, neglect and self neglect of vulnerable adults ages 18 and older.

LONG TERM CARE OMBUDSMAN

Advocates and assists in problem solving for persons in long term care settings (assisted living centers or skilled nursing and rehabilitation centers). Problems, complaints or concerns focus on choices, residents' rights, quality of care or other long term care issues.

VOICE (Volunteer Ombudsmen Improving Care for out Elders)

Recruits and trains volunteers to visit, and advocate for residents in long term care settings.


RSVP (Retired and Senior Volunteer Program)



Eastern Idaho Community Action Partnership helps at-risk individuals and families meet their basic needs and increase independence through support and education.



Area Agency on Aging of Eastern Idaho

Working to maintain the independence and dignity of Eastern Idaho's seniors and caregivers.

CASE MANAGEMENT

Locates, mobilizes and coordinates a variety of in-home supportive services to ensure that the senior client is able to remain in their home, while their physical and safety needs are being met.

CONGREGATE MEALS

Provides mid-day nutritious meals at 16 senior community centers.

HOME DELIVERED MEALS

Provides mid-day nutritious meals that are delivered from 13 senior community centers to individuals who are homebound.

HEALTH LENDING LIBRARY

Maintains a library containing books and other media on health care and issues on aging which are available for loan.

HOMEMAKER SERVICES

Provides assistance to frail or homebound seniors with housekeeping, laundry, essential errands, and help with meal prep. Cost to the client is based on a sliding fee scale depending on income. Limited funding available for heavy housekeeping projects and snow or leaf removal on a case by case basis.

INFORMATION & ASSISTANCE

Provides information regarding services currently available to senior citizens. I&A can also assist individuals and their caregivers in accessing programs and services by making appropriate referrals. Printed resources and information available.

LEGAL ASSISTANCE

Gives legal advice, counseling, or representation by an attorney (or other person acting under the supervision of an attorney) to older individuals with economic or social needs through Idaho Legal Aid.

OUTREACH

Locates and identifies the hard-to-reach, isolated, and withdrawn individuals 60 years of age and older and links them with available resources.

CAREGIVER SUPPORT GROUP

Provides support information and resources for individuals that are caring for their loved one, parents or spouses. Meetings are held on the first Tuesday of every month.

GRANDPARENTS RAISING GRANDCHILDREN PROGRAM

Works with individuals who are in need of information, resources, and support regarding a variety of issues including: medical, legal, behavior and school issues. Also available is a Grandparents Raising Grandchildren Support Group that meets the last Tuesday of every month.

RESPIRE (Relief for the caregiver in the home)

Gives "the gift of time" to full time caregivers by providing companionship and supervision to homebound adults. This preventative program also enables the caregiver to remain healthy as well as permits the homebound person to remain at home. (In facility care options are available in Bonneville County.)

TRANSPORTATION

Provides free transportation to take seniors to and from community facilities and resources for the purpose of applying for and receiving services, reducing isolation, or promoting independence.
